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Happy New Year! I hope you and your families had a restful Holiday season and have entered 2022 with focus, renewed energy, and commitment to our student's success.

In accordance with CDC guidance, MCPS will implement a multi-layer health and safety protocol that includes multiple strategies to protect school community members from COVID-19, including: use of masks/face coverings, vaccine promotion, enhanced sanitation, frequent hand-washing, improved ventilation, quarantine, and contact tracing in the event that a student or staff member tests positive. Specifically, MCPS will implement the following health and safety practices in schools, offices and on school buses.

NEWS AND HAPPENINGS AROUND THE MILL:

<u>SY22-23 Student Course Registration:</u> Course registration for the 2022-23 school year will begin when schools resume after Winter Break. Students will receive information via counselor presentations in their English and ESOL classes the week of January 3rd according to the tentative schedule below:

- Jan. 3rd and Jan 4th: ESOL classes
- Jan. 5th: 11th grade English classes
- Jan 6th: 10th grade English classes
- Jan. 7th: 9th grade English classes

During these sessions, students will learn about graduation requirements and receive a registration card to review course offerings. During that week, please ask your child for their registration card to talk about courses for next school year, and to provide the parent signature.

Beginning January 13th, students will <u>fully register for classes in Synergy</u> via their Social Studies classes, with counselor support, according to the tentative schedule below:

- Jan. 13th: 11th grade Social Studies classes
- Jan. 14th: 10th grade Social Studies classes (and select AP 9th grade classes)
- Jan. 18th: 9th grade Social Studies classes (and select AP 10th grade classes)

Students and families in self-contained Special Ed programs will receive information separately on their completed schedules for next school year.

AP EXAM INFORMATION

Payment and Fee Waiver Deadlines Reminder

If you have not paid for your AP exam, please do so as soon as possible to avoid a financial obligation. If you have any questions, please contact Erin Schultze (<u>Erin Schultze@mcpsmd.orq</u>) in room B201.

To pay online, go online to https://osp.osmsinc.com/montgomerymd/ and click on the High School tab and select Watkins Mill High School. Select AP exam fees and add to cart to pay for your exam. A 3.75% fee will be added to the purchase price of a school purchase as a site service fee. This fee is not collected by MCPS but is a processing fee of the company hosting site. If you have filled out the Waiver form, then please only pay for the 15\$ exam fee.

- To pay by check, make checks/money orders payable Watkins Mill High School and include your student's name and ID number in the subject line. Send your payment to Lisa Holderman at 10301 Apple Ridge Rd, Gaithersburg, MD 20879. Give it to Mrs. Holderman in the Financial Office.
- If your family needs support in paying for some or whole exam fee, please fill out the Title IV Scholarship Form that is linked <u>HERE</u>.

Seleccione las tarifas del examen AP y agréguelas al carrito para pagar su examen. Se agregará una tarifa de 3.75% al precio de compra de la compra de una escuela como tarifa de servicio del sitio. MCPS no cobra esta tarifa, pero es una tarifa de procesamiento del sitio de alojamiento de la empresa. Si ha completado el formulario de exención, pague solo la tarifa del examen de \$ 15.

Applicants must be permanent residents of Maryland, but may attend any accredited U.S. college, university or vocational school.
