



Frequently Asked Questions

Is TAWS a school? TAWS can serve as a state-wide school or a program with concurrent enrollment with a local district. Currently, TAWS is a program available in Montgomery County Public Schools.

What are the requirements for admission? Students must be a junior or senior.

Do students get grades? Yes.

Do students have to have a job? Students should have a job or be actively searching for a job.

What about college? Students will have the opportunity to take college courses during the program. In addition, each student will have an individualized career plan, which will include postsecondary education.

Who will get updates on my progress? It is important that there is a free flow of communication. Counselors and parents (for those under 18) will receive frequent updates on your progress in the program.

What are the benefits of dual enrollment?

- Graduate from high school with college credit(s)
- Engagement with college professors and your peers
- Save money on college tuition

Can TAWS help students find a job? TAWS is part of a network of employers and apprenticeship, increasing the opportunities to move into high paying careers.

Can students play sports or be in the band at school? Yes, if the schedule allows it. In this program, the work schedule determines the academic schedule.

Are there apprenticeship opportunities available? Yes. TAWS actively promotes youth and registered apprenticeships.

What supports does TAWS provide? TAWS provides career and college counseling, academic support, and mental health support. TAWS builds a network around students to support them to reach their goals.
