<u>Say the Right Thing the First Time: Communication Strategies for Supervisors</u>


March 1, 8:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m., URSC, Room 3 F

The University of Maryland Creative Initiatives in Teacher Education (CITE) program targets MCPS support professionals with bachelor's degrees who are interested in becoming elementary school teachers with a focus on special education or ESOL. During the 2½ year program, candidates work as paraeducators and are able to complete work-site internships without having to take approved leave. The CITE cohort we are spotlighting began in January 2019. We asked these future teachers a few questions about the CITE program!
