# Curriculum Connections



#### Reading

Our literature focuses for the month of March is on informational text:

- Ask and answer questions, main topic, to get information and new meanings of unfamiliar words
- Vocabulary:

- collaborative conversations, confirm understanding of text read aloud, affixes,
- Real-life connections between words and their use
- Name author and illustrator and define roles of each

Please continue to practice the Kindergarten sight words. It is important that your child is able to recognize these words in text and be able to spell them correctly. Knowing these words will make your child's reading stronger and more fluid.

We ask for you to continue to read with your child each night and review the high frequency words we have introduced so far this year.

#### **Writing**



Students are working on becoming more independent writers and writing multiple sentences that go together. This month our focuses will include:

- Informative based writing
- Reviewing Conventions: correct use of spacing, capital/ lowercase letters, and punctuation.

- Name a topic, supply information about the topic, add drawings, use technology
- Identifying and using nouns in our writing
- Using descriptive words in their writing

Please continue to let your child write for themselves on their homework assignments. It is important for them to practice proper handwriting and start to word stretch independently.

#### <u>Math</u>

We continue to explore and investigate math concepts. We have started our third marking period with:

- Identify 2D shapes
- We are expanding our exploration in Geometry and are in the middle of exploring 3D shapes Identifying their attributes and

comparing the shapes Later this month we will:

- Decompose numbers up to 10 in more than one way
- Addition and subtraction fluency within 5
- Representing addition and subtraction within 10

#### Reminder:

We are down to the second half of our Kindergarten year. Please check with your child and see how they are doing with their personal supplies. Many of us need new crayons.

#### **Social Studies & Science**

Our social studies focus for the month will continue with economics and focus more on:

- Wants and needs
- Goods and Services
- Recognizing human resources as people who make or grow goods and provide services
- Situations where people make economic choices

- How goods are acquired: trading money
- Situations where people make choices: different values of goods



In science this month we will focus on external features of animals and plants and their classifications.

Comparing animal external features and finding similarities with humans.

We have been studying habitats of local animals. While you are out on walks or drives encourage a discussion about habitats. You will be surprised!!
