

# Curriculum Highlights









### Benchmark (Reading/Writing)-

- Students are working on Unit 1 for Reading Their consumable is
   Government in Action. Students can also access a digital copy of
   Government in Action through Benchmark Universe. There is a drop down
   menu on their chrome book for Benchmark access
   <a href="https://mcpsmd.benchmarkuniverse.com/">https://mcpsmd.benchmarkuniverse.com/</a>. As noted in our September
   newsletter, the digital version is a great way to save mark-ups, or listen to
   an audio version of the text to promote fluency and decoding skills.
- We are doing multiple reads and having collaborative discussions about key details of the text. We will be annotating/marking up texts, sequencing events, and writing main ideas & summaries. In each text, we are searching for the problem and solution.
- ELC Reading/Writing Students are enjoying the start to Unit 1 as they begin
  to build their ELC portfolios with artifacts including their reading and writing
  goals. This week we are reading short stories from Junior Great Books where
  students will engage in a shared inquiry discussion. In writing students are
  publishing their narrative as we take their story through the writing process.
- Math 4- Students will be taking their End of Module 1 assessment on Monday, October 10th. Then, we will begin working on Module 2 which involves metric conversions.
- Compacted Math %-\_We are currently working on metric conversions and will also be learning multi-step word problems involving mass, distance and length in Module 2. We should be completing Module 2 by the end of the first week of October. Module 3 study includes area and perimeter, multi-digit multiplication and division.

- <u>Science</u>-We have almost completed our work on energy transfer during this marking period. This week, we will be building circuits. Next week we will construct a solar oven to convert radiant light energy from the sun to heat energy.
- Social Studies We will be studying early settlement patterns in Maryland.

The daily slide and MCPS classroom pages will indicate Thursday classwork. Homework • Please use the Eureka Succeed (Bed) book for math homework. Students should spend 20 active minutes a night on their math homework. Homework is considered practice work and reinforces lessons taught in the classroom. Homework helper pages are located on the page prior to their homework in the Succeed (Bed) book. Students should be working on their multiplication facts if they do not yet have automaticity. For reading, we strongly encourage students to read nightly for 20-30 minutes.
