DETAILS: Meet in the Media Center

- **The University of Maryland and the Coalition Application.** Learn about the Coalition Application - open a Coalition Application account, continue to work on your application, learn what college “pages” are, understand the nuances of each section. Additionally, a UMD admission representative will elaborate on what UMD is looking for in an applicant, share UMD essay tips, and walk us through the UMD portion of the Coalition Application. Planning to apply to UMD? This workshop is definitely for YOU. THIS SESSION IS ONLY OFFERED ONCE.
- **MONEY MATTERS!!!** Learn how to research the cost of college attendance, understand the sources of financial aid, determine your financial “fits,” use the Net Price Calculator, maximize the likelihood of receiving financial aid, and search for scholarships
- **The College Search.** Understand the variables that impact college choices. Determine which variables matter most to you in your college selection. Learn how to discover good fit colleges: academic fit, social fit, financial fit. Start or add to your college list.
- **College Essay Motivator.** Ms. Mahoney will offer the same motivators used at the 4-day College Essay Writing Workshops. During the 4-day College Essay Writing Workshops, students will COMPLETE essays during the workshop. With this College *Readiness* Workshop, students will START essays but will continue/complete the essays on their own time. BUT WE DON'T LEAVE YOU UNSUPPORTED: Plenty of essay encouragement and feedback is available during Essay Critique Week. B-CC English teachers, professional writers and editors join us to polish college essays. The product is the same: at least one completed college essay.
- **Why UMBC? and The Common Application.** Put on your seatbelts for one of our highest energy college representatives, Christine Jenkins from UMBC. Learn “Why UMBC?” Then take a deep dive into **The Common Application**. Come to open a CA account, continue filling out the CA, learn the ins, outs and quirks of the Common Application, and link the Common Application to Naviance. Hardly anyone avoids the Common App, so get a head start.
- **The Details.** Complete B-CC required college paperwork. Start or complete your student self-reflection. Start a resume or fine-tune your resume. I GUARANTEE that our AH-mazing resume guru, Ms. Green, will astound you with how you can improve your resume. Everyone should have a resume. A resume is an important document to have for many reasons: to attach to college applications, to include with scholarship applications, to have for a prospective employer. Learn tips on interviewing, for college or jobs. How can we be so lucky? Mr. Phil Pine, founder of Capital Educators, will share strategies to prepare for and pull off a great interview. Do you know how to pivot??? Come find out.
- **Navigating Naviance.** Learn how to maximize the use of Naviance to aide your college selection and application process.
