

Happy New Year! It seems hard to believe that we have almost completed our first semester of this school year. I wanted to offer a few reminders about requirements and updates to the APPS program. First, APPS students need to maintain a 3.5 unweighted GPA. When the semester ends I will be checking the GPAs of all students. If you are struggling, I will meet with you to discuss support solutions. You also need to commit to attending at least 2 APPS events per semester. These can be guest speakers or field trips. Lastly, students in the class of 2026 and beyond were supposed to take an APPS research class during their senior year. Unfortunately, we don't have enough resources to offer that class. Seniors will still be responsible for creating their Showcase but do not have to take a research class in addition to that presentation.

The freshman have a chance to visit The United States Capitol at the beginning of February. There they will engage in a simulation about how a bill becomes a law and take a tour of the Capitol. Please be on the lookout for an email with more information regarding this field trip.




