# **PRINCIPAL'S REPORT** by Dr. Joe Rubens

Dr. Rubens first wanted to address the severed gas line that occurred in the new wing of school under construction. He said he chose to do an evacuation by pulling the fire alarm. They got all-clear from PEPCO & fire marshal. Dr. Rubens apologized for any communication concerns and explained he usually has a designee to maintain communication with PTSA President. He stated that staff provided hard copy of what happened to car riders that afternoon at dismissal.

## **KENNEDY SPOTLIGHT:** by Diana Gomez-Sanchez and Akilah Lewis

<u>Diana Gomez-Sanchez. Senior in Business Academy, in Leadership Lab within the Business Academy</u>: she said she likes the ability to branch out into different courses like accounting and business management. She mentioned she has classes with some of the same students since freshman year. Speakers included business owners. She has also participated in Chick-fil-A Leadership Academy (educator monthly, but also meeting more frequently). In the academy, we research our favorite businesses and entrepreneurs. Prepared me for how the workforce works, financial literacy, budgeting, and organizing my finances as an adult. Previous Accounts Balance on 3/14/2022 was \$7,453.45. Current Accounts Balance as of 4/26/2022 \$8,413.65. Donations \$1,010.20, Expenses for Staff Appreciation Week was \$50 gift card. Expected to have \$6000 to spend this year. The JFK Fund was supposed to be for specific activities. Our target was \$15K, which we did not meet.

Kristen Walker Painemilla will request an increase in the budget for Staff Appreciation Week. Currently \$1500 is allocated. Bryan Benesch proposed to raise the budget for Staff Appreciation

from \$1500 to \$2300, Joe Jenkins seconded the motion. At least 2/3 of the membership at the meeting voted to approve the change.

No new members joined in the last two months. We have 78 people who have paid their PTSA membership (11 staff, 10 students, 54 parents/guardians, 2 grandparents, 1 community member).

# **POST-PROM DISCUSSION AND PLANNING** by Joe Jenkins and Keir Lewis

Kristen Walker Painemilla mentioned there will be a flyer requesting \$20.22 donation for Post-Prom. Anticipate 200-250 students for Post-Prom. She has created a special portion of MemberHub donation site for this Post-Prom donation.

Tanya Jenkins asked what the budget was. Original budget was \$3000. Don't have a venue yet. Also want to provide food & decorations. Hope Mr. Joseph is available to be DJ. White Oak Bowling Alley (a potential site) is temporarily closed due to flood.

Rosensteel Hall or JFK school are our "last resort" locations. Dr. Rubens emailed school administrator Higgins, but we have to budget for ICB worker(s) for building services & clean-up as well as 2 school security assistants if we have it in the school. Mont Co Police will work for free, but will have to share a video with students in advance.

Can use half of cafeteria plus restrooms. Dr. Rubens will see if the gym is available (new lights may be being installed). Some concern that students may not come if the Post-Prom is at the school. Ms. Lewis can do a quick Google survey ("what theme would they want") and have the Class President send it out to Seniors. Some schools are choosing to not have a Post-Prom. Tanya suggested if don't do Post-Prom, then use that money on something else at Prom. Bryan Benesch pointed out not everyone wants to go to prom and suggested maybe we use the money raised with \$20.22 for a little something for <u>all</u> seniors. Last year, the Senior Yard Signs were paid by JFK & MCPS. MCPS will not pay for it this year.

## **STAFF APPRECIATION** by Kirsten Walker Painemilla

Staff Appreciation Week is May 2-6. Tuesday May 3: yard cards & breakfast for staff. May 4: Dr. Rubens/JFK will provide lunch. May 5: PTSA provided Cinco de Mayo lunch. May 5: ice cream & treats by Dr. Rubens/JFK and goodie bags by PTSA. Zolfa Valiani-Merchant suggested creating a SignUp Genius for parents to donate gift cards for raffles. Betsy Alley-Strocher pointed out gift cards are highly discouraged by MCCPTA. Ms. Lewis said staff love to be fed and little surprises in mailboxes are well received. Joe Jenkins agreed we should increase budget for staff because the staff are a big piece of supporting our children during COVID. Zolfa mentioned they are our most valuable resource, especially during current times of pandemic. Ms. Lewis suggested, to carry the momentum forward, to do something during preservice week in August, maybe raffle off \$20 of classroom supplies.

Darrell Beutel chatted to Kirsten Murray the following: "I have to go to another appointment. But I did want to follow up on the red light running from last month. All of our contacts to the County Council have been very positive, and they are pushing for more infrastructure at that intersection. Problem is that DoT is currently renegotiating the traffic camera contract, and while they have the intersection on this list, they must wait until negotiations are done. So good news, but patience necessary."

Bryan Benesch moved to close the meeting, Ms. Lewis seconded. Meeting was adjourned at 7:35 pm.
