Tips & Tools for Applying & Accepting Financial Aid in the State of Maryland ● FAQ's ● The Maryland College Aid Processing System (MD CAPS) accounts for accepting financial aid. Set up the MD CAPS account using this link. Complete the FAFSA (check individual college deadlines for priority date due). Check your MD CAPS account on a regular basis after filing the FAFSA. Complete all items on the checklist. Links and forms for documents required will be available to download in your MD CAPS account. For all applicant eligibility requirements, including how to sign up for a MDCAPS account can be found on the MHEC website. If you have questions, call the Office of Student Financial Assistance at 410-767-3300 and follow the prompt to press #1. You can also meet virtually with a financial aid specialist to talk more about your options when applying for financial aid to achieve your higher education goals.

RESOURCE: The Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship is available each academic year to students who enroll at a Maryland community college. The Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship is a last dollar award, available to students who plan to enroll in credit-bearing coursework leading to a vocational certificate, certificate, or an associate degree. All interested applicants must submit either the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the MHEC One-App each year.


