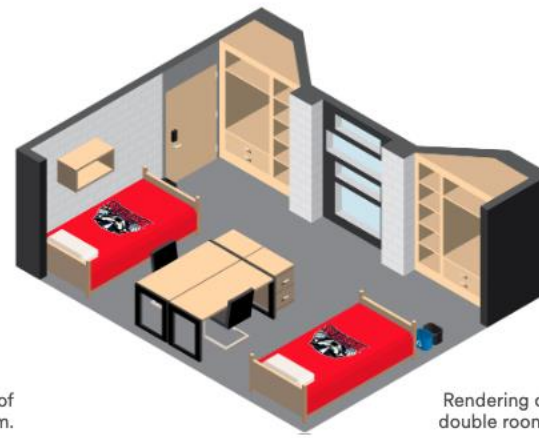

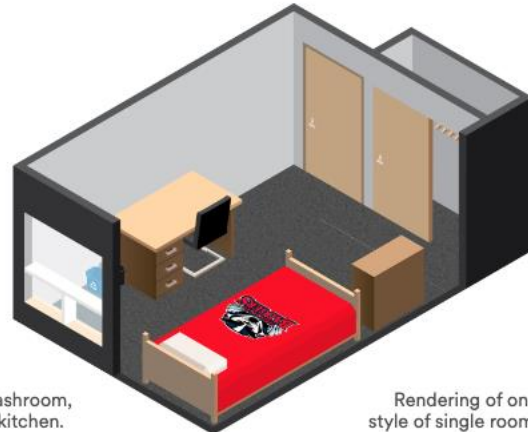

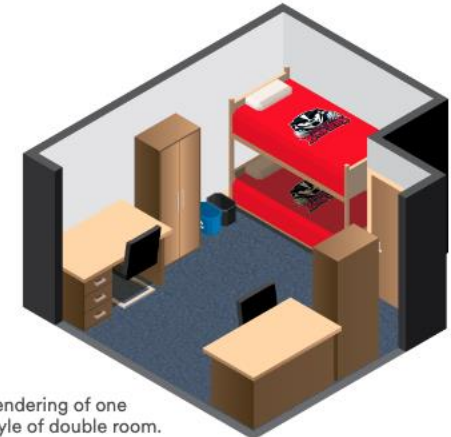

Emerging Market Entrance Award \$2,500

Students will automatically receive the award if they are citizens of Colombia, Kenya, Malaysia, Sri Lanka and Pakistan.

International Curriculum Award \$1,000

Students are automatically considered if they have achieved an A- admissions average and one of the following:

- IB diploma successful completion
- AP: incoming first year undergraduate students with three AP courses with an exam score of 4 or more
- A-level final year average of C or higher

International Student Ambassador Award

Up to \$23,000**

Awarded annually to a maximum of 10 students who did not hold citizenship, permanent residency or refugee status in Canada. A separate application is required.

English language requirements for undergraduate studies

If your first language is not English, you must prove proficiency with one of the following, or equivalent:

IELTS

Overall 6.5, no band below 6.0
For co-op Accounting, 7.0, with no band below 6.5

TOEFL IBT (destination code: 0895)

Overall 88, no band below 21 on speaking and 21 on writing. For co-op Accounting, overall 100, minimum 27 on writing and 27 on speaking

Duolingo

Minimum score of 110
Minimum score of 120 for Co-op Accounting (BAcc)

CAEL

Overall 70, no other band score under 60

Brock Intensive English Language Program (IELP)

Successful completion of Level 5

Brock English Placement Test (BEPT)

Minimum overall score of 600, with no subtest below 400

How do I read the admissions chart?



OUAC Code

The program code you will place on your application at ouac.on.ca

Programs and degrees

The name of the program and degree conferred upon graduation.

Co-op

Indicates if co-op is available.

Required Grade 12 subjects

These courses will be included in the calculation of your admission average.

Recommended courses

These courses are NOT required for admission, but may be beneficial in preparing for program content. No admissions preference will be given to students with these courses.

Expected admission average

These ranges are based on admission averages from previous years. Exact cut-offs for 2023 entry will be determined according to program availability and the quality and quantity of applications received. Achieving the minimum percentage listed does not guarantee admission.
