Modern World Languages - Mr. Anthony DeRosa


As the chill of winter wears on, we wish you the warmest of Wootton welcomes from the World Languages Department. This month, please allow us to highlight the French Honor Society.

Sponsor Madame Maass and her elected officers lead the group through a series of initiatives focusing on cultural and linguistic enrichment, charitable fundraising, and ecological amelioration. Wootton students of French can take advantage of the peer-tutoring opportunities offered by the members of the society. All year long, the special mentor program pairs honor society students with those currently taking French 1. In addition, honor society members are available during lunch every Thursday to help any students of French at whatever level.


In February the society comes together for a movie night where classic and current films (en français) are screened. In March, it has become a tradition to sponsor a gallery walk of francophone art in D. C. under the expert leadership of retired art teacher Jessica Coleman. The entire Wootton community is invited to join in. Also in March, the society enjoys an outing to the Mon Ami Gabi restaurant. Fundraising is an integral part of the society. All money raised goes directly to Les Médecins sans frontiers (Doctors Without Borders). In October, a partnership with the Crêpes-à-go-go restaurant saw part of their revenue on a particular day go to the honor society. In November, a society-sponsored bake sale at a local shopping center netted \$1,000 for the doctor's society. The funds were earmarked to combat the continuing Ebola problem in the Democratic Republic of Congo. Lastly, respect for and protection of the environment has been a critical focal point for the society. All year, they collect used batteries and Brita filters to ensure they are disposed of properly. (There is even a schoolwide contest to see which first-period class can bring in the most items.) On April 28, the focus will be on the Paris climate accords. On that day, the society will sponsor a visit to a local recycling plant. Members of the entire Wootton community will be invited - limited to 60 participants.

In addition, members of the society are taking part in a contest to design a reusable stainless-steel bottle with the FHS logo. The completed bottles will be gifted to seniors as soon as they complete their required FHS hours.

Each year, current students of French 3 are invited to apply for membership. Formal inductions will take place at a ceremony in the auditorium on the evening of May 27.

The Career & Technology Department is excited for second semester learning! Students enrolled in our Technology courses that count towards the graduation requirement will investigate a variety of exciting content this semester. Students in FOCS will engage in units built around programming, data analysis and representation, and robotics. Students in AP CS Principles will learn how the Internet works, how computers represent and store digital information, examine the use of big data and how its use affects issues of privacy, as well as complete the Explore task for their AP Exam Portfolio.

Juniors in the Academy of Information Technology (AOIT) program will participate in a mock interview session on Wednesday, February 19, 2020 from 2:45pm-5:00pm in the Wootton HS Media Center. This event helps them practice and develop professional interviewing skills.

Science Department - Mr. Michael Thompson

The Wootton Science Department is very excited to begin semester 2! All classes have been shuffled a little bit, and students are finding themselves with new seats, new classmates, and often new rooms and new teachers. Biology classes are taking on cellular respiration and other major processes in cell cycles, which will set them up for genetics and evolution. Chemistry classes will tackle gas laws, bonding, and solutions. Physics classes are integrating a study of the earth's climate with basic thermal transfer processes as well as principles of waves and sound. All of these classes are designed to pique student curiosity and prepare them for upper level courses and electives. As parents who attended the December Information Night discovered, we have many options that match student interests.

In January, we administered the Maryland Integrated Science Assessment (MISA) to over 400 students, mostly juniors. Taking this meets the science testing requirement for current classes of 2020, 2021, and 2022. Current 9th graders will have a minimum required score to meet their graduation requirement. The test spans topics from Biology to Chemistry to Physics, with integrated Earth and space science components as well. We expect Wootton students to be well-prepared when the exam has the minimum score requirement.

But for now, we continue to share our love for all things science-related with Wootton students!

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Important Information

AP News

This is a reminder to all students that Advanced Placement (AP) testing will be occurring during the first two weeks of May (May 4- May 15). The deadline for registration was November 11 and final payment was January 5. The testing schedule is posted on the Wootton Webpage and the AP teachers have posted their exam dates as well. Our testing locations will be in classrooms at Wootton High School and at The Universities at Shady Grove (USG). There will be several student administrative meetings in April during lunches. Students will get test security, logistics, and testing requirement information during these meetings. There will also be a final list of specific room locations for each exam during the administrative meetings.

Students who have testing accommodations in their classes need to make sure they have those accommodations. Parents and students should check in with their counselors to make sure the accommodations have been accepted by College Board. Students taking an AP exam on a specific day are excused from school for that day.
