Completely filled out SSL Verification forms turned in after March 30, 2023, and before June 2, 2023, will be processed by June 9, 2023. June 2, 2023 is the last due date for the 2022-2023 school year!



Completely filled out SSL Verification forms turned in after the January 6, 2023, due date and by the March 30, 2023, due date, were processed by April 2, 2023. Incomplete SSL Verification forms were returned to students through 1st-period teachers.

Any middle school student who has submitted completely filled out SSL Verification forms to show the completion of the 75-hour SSL high school graduation requirement (for the first time in middle school) by March 30, 2023, will receive the Superintendent's SSL Award. No application or other form is required to earn the Superintendent's SSL Award. The 10 SSL hours students may potentially earn through grade 8 social studies class do NOT count towards the Superintendent Award. For students that earned the grade-level curriculum 10 SSL hours, the MCPS SSL office will process hours during the summer. If you are currently in 6th or 7th grade you have until late March of your 8th-grade year to earn the Superintendent Award.

Students who wish to submit SSL forms from previous school years must write an appeal to the school's principal outlining the circumstances for why the SSL form(s) were not turned in by the systemwide deadline. The school's principal will consider the information presented and make a final decision about the appeal.

after June 1, 2022, and submitted to the

school's SSL coordinator by September 23, 2022, will be reviewed and processed

Please note that all SSL forms for service completed during the summer of 2022 or the 2022-2023 school year should be submitted to the school's SSL coordinator on a rolling basis by the recommended due date of January 6, 2023, but no later than the required deadline of June 2, 2023.





SSL Awards

- Any high school senior who has submitted documentation to show the completion of 240 SSL hours or more by March 30, 2023, will earn the Certificate of Meritorious Service along with a purple tassel for graduation.
- Any middle school student who has submitted documentation to show the completion of the 75-hour SSL graduation requirement (for the first time in middle school) by March 30, 2023, will receive the Superintendent's SSL Award. No application or other form is required to earn the Superintendent's SSL Award.

The required deadline for all documentation that qualifies seniors for the Certificate of Meritorious Service and middle school students for the Superintendent's SSL Award was March 30, 2023. All completely filled-out, electronic and hard copy, SSL Verification forms turned in by March 30, 2023, due date were processed. Incomplete SSL Verification forms were returned to students through 1st-period teachers.

The 10 SSL hours students may potentially earn through grade 8 social studies class do NOT count towards the Superintendent Award. Grade-level curriculum 10 SSL hours are processed automatically during the summer.
